I hope that you are energized by what you've helped them achieve by supporting our training programs, events, and grant and award competitions.

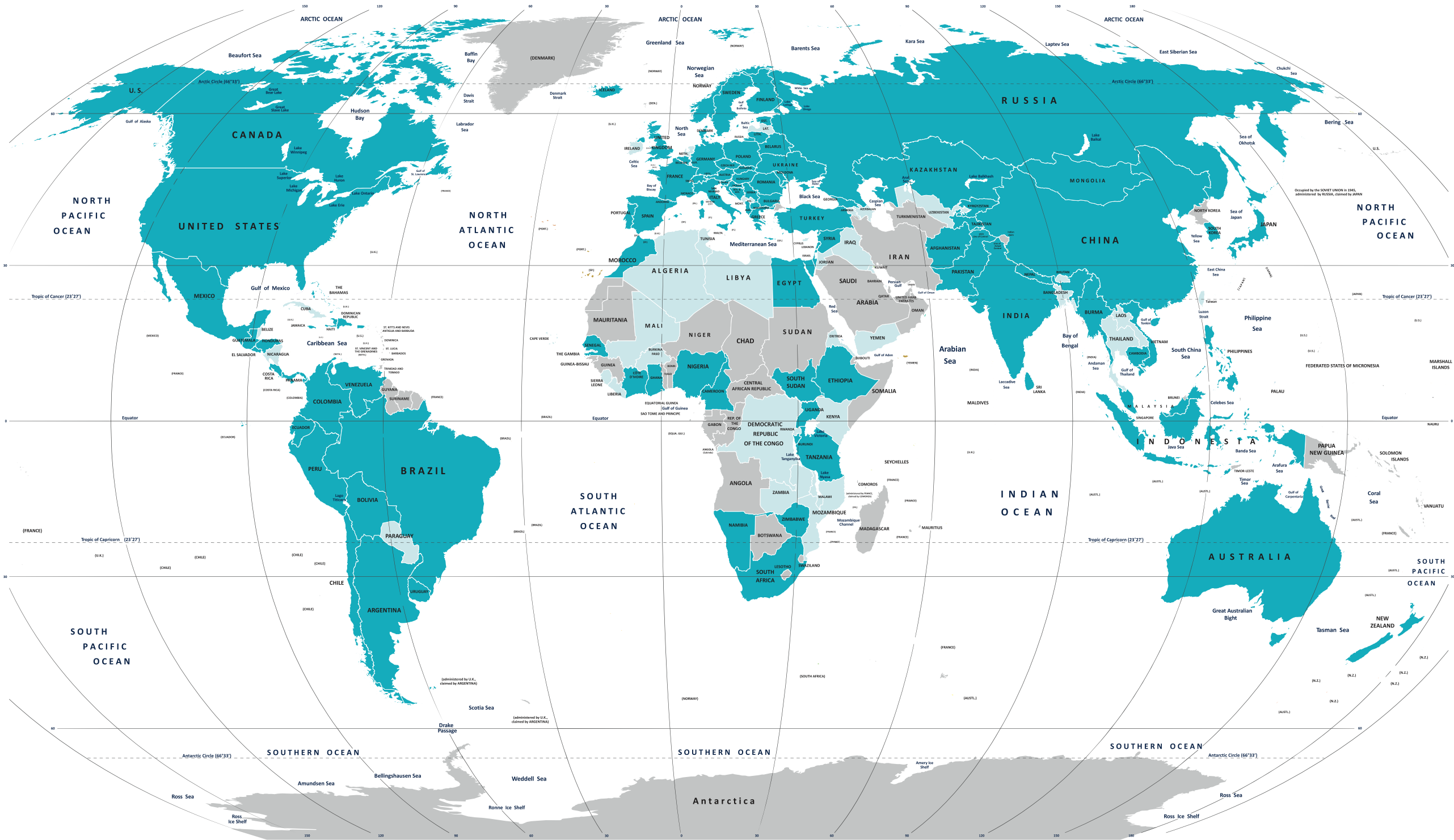

IMPACT: CROATIA

When the Croatian government passed a property tax for the first time, Lipa Taxpayers Association refused to stand by and allow this new tax to wreak havoc on the country’s troubled economy. Since nearly 90 percent of Croatians own their own homes, the new tax threatened to hurt rich and poor alike—and with the country’s population already in decline, the government’s emphasis should be on growth, not on imposing financial burdens. Lipa launched a campaign that combined grassroots activism, research, and media outreach—and their efforts stopped the tax and helped change the way Croatians think about taxation.



IMPACT: BURUNDI

For new entrepreneurs, the challenge of starting a business can be daunting—especially when you live in a country like Burundi, where 89 percent of the economy is dependent on farming. But easing the burdens of starting a business in Burundi can help new entrepreneurs succeed. The Center for Development and Enterprises (CDE) Great Lakes’ award-winning Birashoboka (which means “It’s Possible”) campaign has successfully worked with the Ministry of Finance in Burundi to reduce the cost of registering a business from 140,000 francs (USD \$78) to 40,000 francs (USD \$22). The project also trained 1,500 aspiring entrepreneurs (and counting) in sound business practices. CDE-Great Lakes is only getting started. This young organization has set its sights on strategic reforms that will help improve the business environment of not only Burundi, but also Rwanda and the Democratic Republic of the Congo. CDE-Great Lakes won Atlas Network’s 2018 Africa Liberty Award for the Birashoboka project.





IMPACT: ARGENTINA

Libertad y Progreso *Buenos Aires, Argentina*

Using technology got a little easier in Argentina when the Macri administration eliminated a 35 percent tariff on laptops and tablets. Before the tariff was removed, parents, school teachers, and small business entrepreneurs were forced to pay inflated prices for laptops. Analysis by the Buenos Aires-based Libertad y Progreso, the nonprofit organization that successfully campaigned for the tariff's repeal, found that Argentines were actually paying double what their neighbors in Chile paid for the same computer products. Atlas Network invested in Libertad y Progreso's research and advocacy project, which showed that eliminating the tariff on computer products would spur job growth and have a positive impact on education, creativity, and competitiveness. Their work brought national attention to the high cost of technology, and within a year the tariff was repealed.



ATLAS NETWORK'S CENTER FOR LATIN AMERICA

In November 2018, Atlas Network launched the Center for Latin America, which promotes peace, justice, and opportunity to all in a region in the midst of volatile change. We strengthen and leverage a partner network of more than 80 independent civil society organizations based in the countries of Latin America. These partners are ideally positioned to develop and implement home-grown solutions to poverty and other public policy challenges.

The Center for Latin America's partners share a general worldview that societies flourish when individual liberty is protected, the rule of law is respected by all, and governments' powers are limited. We aspire to identify and pursue reforms that improve the regional understanding of the benefits of trade and economic freedom, as well as spotlight the dangers of protectionism and corruption that undermine prosperity for all.

Building on nearly four decades of regional investment by Atlas Network, the Center for Latin America provides partners with world-class training and mentoring, grant competitions for project funding, and networking opportunities that foster peer-to-peer learning and collaboration. Dr. Roberto Salinas León serves as the Center's director.

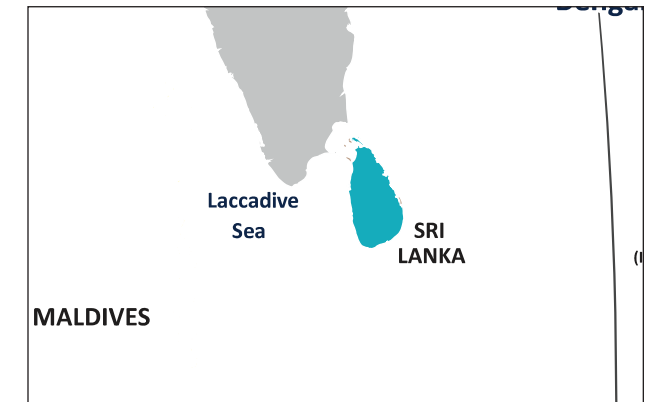
The Buckeye Institute

Over the last five years, Ohio's Buckeye Institute has been relentless in its quest to reform the state's broken criminal justice system. Today, Ohio's prison admissions rate has hit a 27-year low—and Buckeye's work to protect the rights of the accused and save Ohio taxpayers millions of dollars is at the core of the state's success. Their efforts have reduced the state's prison population to below 50,000, dramatically slashed the recidivism rate from 40 to 27 percent, reduced prison admissions by nearly 10 percent, expanded opportunities for thousands of people leaving prison, and redirected \$40 million to Ohio communities for the treatment of addiction and mental health issues.

Tariffs can impose a devastating burden on people struggling to survive. In Sri Lanka, the cost of sanitary napkins made it difficult for women living in poverty to buy the hygiene products they needed every month—which meant that girls were missing school and women were missing work because they couldn't leave their homes. Advocata Institute worked with the government to drop a 30 percent import tariff and a number of taxes that more than doubled the cost of sanitary napkins. Today more women can afford their hygiene needs, making them more productive and less likely to miss important opportunities at work or school.

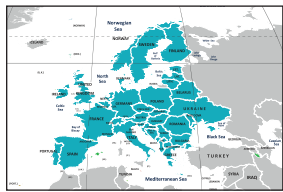


REGIONAL LIBERTY FORUMS AND LIBERTY FORUM & FREEDOM DINNER 2019
